

Personal Worker Credited

85-Member Church Leads 96 to Christ in 11 Months

CORUNNA, Mich.—The M-21 church which formerly had just 85 members converted 96 persons in 11 months. Attendance is up and contribution is 50 per cent higher.

This 85 per cent increase has been credited largely to Bob Danklefsen, who was converted

five years ago. A graduate of Purdue University in bio-chemistry, he was an industrial chemist before his baptism and is now a full-time personal worker at the M-21 congregation.

Before taking over as full-time director, he converted 11 persons in five months. In the first six months of his full-time job, he led more than 50 to Christ.

The M-21 members aren't letting Danklefsen do all of the work, however. Elder Ken Stewart recently baptized five in one week. Another elder, J.C. Carr, and the local minister have been teaching and baptizing. About 50 of the 200-member congregation are now active in personal work.
