World Radio XXIX -19 Beams into Russia

SEARCY, Ark.—A new radio station near Lisbon, Portugal, Radio Trans Europe, is set to beam 250,000 watts directly into the U.S.S.R. It will carry the World Radio broadcast into Moscow and other Russian cities at 10:00 Wednesday nights, according to G. C. Lockwood of the College church in Searcy, Ark.

Speaker for the new series is Yvan Kolesnikow, a Russian who will preach in Russian. He now lives and works in Montreal, Canada, among the Russian people there.

Kolesnikow's father had

been an Orthodox priest, but left the group to practice New Testament Christianity. In 1930, both Kolesnikow and his father were sentenced to labor camps because of their faith in Christ. Later the son spent five years studying civil engineering in Moscow. He and his family were taken captive by the Germans during the war.
