



STRATHMOOR—Greenfield near Grand River

The Strathmoor Church of Christ began its history Lord's Day afternoon, March 31, 1935, in an abandoned bank building at the corner of Grand River and Lesure Avenues. Six months later more suitable quarters were found to be necessary for the rapidly expanding work, and a shift was made to the Masonic Temple on Hubbell Road.

A number of successful meetings being held by some of the country's outstanding evangelists, the church looked for a location for erecting a building of its own. The present site, Lyndon at Greenfield Avenues, was at length settled upon. Through financial sacrifice on the part of the membership combined with the donation of much of their own labor, a church home a distinct credit to the Cause was erected in 1939.
