The 2001-2002 appropriations act for community colleges requires the colleges to submit various reports to the Department of Career Development (MDCD). Section 221 - North American Indian Tuition Waiver (Complete attached form)

The act states that each community college shall report the following:

- (1) The number of North American Indian students enrolled each term for the previous fiscal year.
- (2) The number of Indian tuition waivers granted each term, and
- (3) The monetary value of the waivers for the previous fiscal year.

Section 223 - Academic Status of High School Students

Subsection (1) states that, upon request, a community college shall inform interested Michigan high schools of the aggregate academic status of its students in a manner prescribed by the Michigan Community College Association and in cooperation with the Michigan Association of Secondary School Principals.

While this language is not new, a new subsection was added that requires each community college to report to the MDCD a summary of the information provided under subsection (1). If your college has provided this information to a high school, please forward a copy of that information to MDCD.

Section 224 - Collaboration with Four-Year Universities (Use your college's narrative for last year as a basis for updating efforts made during 2000-2001)

The Legislature recognizes the importance of education in strengthening Michigan's workforce and encourages the state's public community colleges to explore ways of increasing collaboration and cooperation with 4-year universities, particularly in the areas related to training, instruction, and program articulation. Community colleges must report on steps they have taken to increase collaboration and cooperation with 4-year universities.

Section 401 - At Risk Student Success Program (See attached form for completion instructions.)

Each college must report a summary of all accomplishments under, expenditures for, and compliance with the intent of this program.

- Collaboration with *Walsh College* to deliver a 2+2 degree option for employees of EDS. The company is involved with the development of curriculum and the establishment of an internship opportunity.
- A partnership has been established with *Oakland University* as well as Oakland Schools to develop a technical training center for IT fields. The university would be involved in curriculum development and delivery of training along with the college.
- OCC collaborated with *Oakland University* to provide training services to Meritor Automotive. Twenty classes were offered for 120 participants in blueprint reading, drafting, project management, instrumentation, measurement techniques and servo fundamentals. The training was funded by the state Economic Development Job Training grant program.
- OCC is part of a five-school consortium awarded \$1 million to develop Internet-based training courses for local businesses. The members and the courses they developed are:

- *Oakland University* and OCC are involved in "Project Gear Up", a grant funded activity to provide parents of children at Jefferson Middle School with an adult career counseling center on site at the

school.

- OCC subcontracts with the *Michigan State University* Extension Center to deliver an entrepreneurial training component of the Child Care Provider Training program for welfare recipients in Oakland County.
- OCC, *Lawrence Tech* and Oakland Schools collaborate on the Manufacturing Technology Academy. Students will move through applied education curriculum focused on manufacturing skills.
