Robert Cooper, the president of Ameritech Michigan, thinks he knows how to un a service business.

The Pontiac-born Cooper started his telephone career 24 years ago at hat was then Michigan Bell as a telephone installer.

"I liked my job as a phone installer," said Cooper, 40, who has held imeritech Michigan's top post since April. "It's the kind of job where you work in hour and it's completed. You get a sense of accomplishment and a chance to interact with customers."

Interacting with customers was Cooper's mission during his first six conths as president. He traveled around the state to find out what customers ant. He came to Michigan from Chicago, where he had been vice president of PgDn

His rivals at AT&T, MCI and Sprint call him Ameritech's chief lobbyist in Michigan. They say it's his job to persuade legislators that what's good for meritech is good for Michigan.

Evidence of Cooper's effort could be seen on Jan. 2, when Ameritech announced it would be the first regional Bell to apply to the Federal formunications Commission for permission to offer long-distance telephone service. On hand were several prominent state legislators who spoke in support of Ameritech.

Ameritech has more than \$8 billion invested in the state and has 30,000 active and retired workers living here -- points Cooper cites when debating his ajor long-distance rivals that have a much smaller investment in the state.

Cooper's Michigan credentials are solid. He graduated from Pontiac entral High School and earned a bachelor's degree from Dakland University and MBA from Michigan State University.

He's a member of the National Black MBA Association and the Economic Club f Detroit. He's a life member of the NAACP. Plus he serves on the boards of Home Next: Ctrl+PoDn.PoUp
