

**DALNET FOCUS Session with Wayne State University Unit Heads
August 10, 1995**

Summary of comments/suggestions made:

- 1. *What concerns or suggestions do you have about our current DALNET services, including training, communications, and technical support?***

Training:

- re-establish systematic training program schedule for WSUL staff;
- LUIS training should be given to all full-time and part-time staff/students;
- Staff mode training should be given to all librarians and to all staff who use staff mode records (very important).

Communications:

- distribute an overall schedule of NOTIS hours, including the holiday schedule. Mention that the second weekend is reserved in case the C&IT needs to do maintenance, which might result in NOTIS being late on Sunday morning;
- continue to remind people on PROFS of the holiday schedule close to each holiday;
- continue use of PROFS distribution list for system problems when PROFS is up; call Circulation/Reference desks when notice could not be given in advance or PROFS is down.

Technical Support:

- need strategy for replacing/upgrading equipment, including timeline and funding, e.g., replacing dumb terminals with PC's, wiring/connectivity.

Other:

- new ID's need to be provided faster; 2-3 days turnaround time is desirable;
- ID's need to be available for each Unit to be used as temporary student ID's until student ID's are received.

- II. *What DALNET Online System enhancements do you need most within the next few years while we do our long range planning?***

Location-Based Catalogs (very important):

- location-based capability should also exist for "hook to holdings" display.

Hook to Holdings (very important):

- local holdings need to display first; patrons assume item is not held locally if other libraries' holdings are first.

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Databases:

- search engine improved, e.g., search engine for CD-ROM versions of ERIC and PsycInfo are better than NOTIS MDAS;
- Wilson record loader needs to handle analytics, e.g., for Library Literature;
- record loader needs to handle "Books and Chapters" for PsycInfo;
- need downloading capability;
- Beilstein and Medline access from LUIS PC's;
- DPL's TIP database would be useful at WSU.

Serials Check-in:

- needs to be improved to display better information regarding status of particular issues.

Full-Text:

- DocDirect.

Reports:

- need improved reports for collection development and Technical Services;
- determine needs of libraries and develop reports that are of common interest;
- Recent Acquisitions Lists should be online.

Other:

- DPL's holdings added to GovDoc records.

PACLINK, i.e., 239.50 Links:

- MRLT libraries should be included in "global" search; first WSU materials--then DALNET and MRLT together;
- OCLC FirstSearch;
- area non-NOTIS libraries, e.g., U of M's Law and Business Libraries, UDM's Law Library, U of M Dearborn;
- Lexis/Nexis;
- NOTIS sites, e.g., University of Windsor and Eastern Michigan University;

- area Satellite Campuses, e.g., Western Michigan University's in Troy, MSU Business Center.

III. How do you think our cooperative efforts built around a shared online catalog can best benefit your institution and your library users?

DALNET's Vision:

- unique, local needs exist, e.g., local servers, particular search engines;
- need overarching system to link various pieces and provide needed security.

Partnering/service contracts/cooperation beyond online system:

- these should be explored, including the economic considerations;
- need to learn more about DALNET institutions and what we can offer each other.

Collection Development:

- have responsibility tied to collections; need to be able to rely on each other.

Staff development:

- share expertise, audience, outside speakers, costs.

Reciprocal Borrowing:

- if can get past the political boundaries, all DALNET patrons should be able to use reference services and borrowing without cumbersome structure.

Purchase CD-ROMs/Data Files:

- joint purchase with broad licensing agreements to get the most advantageous price.

Adding DALNET partners:

- determine libraries most beneficial in our shared OPAC;
- extend to "for profit" libraries and those outside the metropolitan area, if possible.

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**Relationship with MRLT Libraries and others in Detroit area
and state:**

- identify their future directions; is the OhioLink model desirable?;
- identify areas for cooperation among MRLT libraries;
- identify opportunities for broader cooperation.

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
