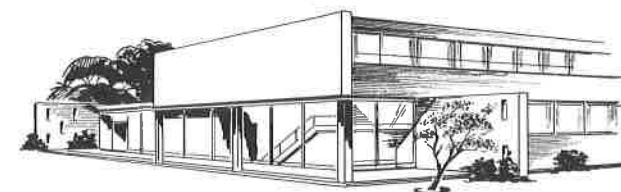
- Michigan Christian College has membership in the American Association of Junior Colleges.

If you are interested in majoring or minoring in music, or if you merely want to achieve practical experience while pursuing courses in another field of interest, opportunities are available to you at MICHIGAN CHRISTIAN COLLEGE.



Although relatively small in comparison with many colleges and universities, MICHIGAN CHRISTIAN COLLEGE offers a variety of musical activities to its students. Those majoring or minoring in music are able to meet requirements for the first

two years of a normal four-year college program. Therefore, you should not assume that you would be handicapped by attending a junior college. On the contrary, there is the advantage

of small classes in which more personal attention can be given.



Music theory and ear training on both Freshman

and Sophomore levels are available for music students. Courses in music literature, music appreciation, and church music are also provided for these students and others who might elect to take such courses.



An extensive record library is being built and listening opportunities are available for all students.



Many students at MICHIGAN CHRISTIAN COLLEGE are afforded an opportunity to participate in the A CAPPELLA CHORUS. This organization consists of several students who are majoring or minoring in music as well as those students who are concentrating in other areas of study. Frequent appearances of the chorus and associate groups are always received with enthusiastic appreciation. Students comprising these groups have toured extensively in Canada

and numerous states in our own nation.



Women in the A Cappella Chorus are given the chance to participate in Women's Ensemble while male members may audition for membership in Men's Quartet. From the music library, these students may choose from a wide variety of sacred and secular material.



Membership in all musical organizations is on the basis of individual auditions and interviews. Participation of members in all scheduled per-

formances is required. It is true that A Cappella and other vocal groups probably require more year-around time from the student than any other campus activity. It is also true that few, if any, student activities are more richly rewarding. Students who are in the musical organizations treasure their membership highly. They consider their association with these groups as one of the most pleasant and valuable college experiences.

In addition to participation in these vocal organizations, Instrumental ensemble membership is available to students who have achieved a reasonable degree of proficiency on a musical

instrument. The nature of this group and its repertoire depends upon the instrumentation of the group during any given year.



Students may also register for private instruction in voice, piano, or a particular instru-

ment. Pianos and practice rooms may be reserved by these students for individual practice sessions.

The music curriculum is designed to fulfill the needs of those who wish to prepare themselves for a career in this field, as well as to provide musical experience and training for all others who desire such.
