ALL-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES. Larger schools by necessity conduct most events on a social club organization basis. Not so at MCC! Whether it's a banquet or a giant scavenger hunt everyone can get caught up in the anticipation and excitement of the event... it's for the entire student body not just a segment. BANQUETS. Three major semi-formal banquets during the year give everyone a chance to dress up and enjoy a specially decorated banquet room complete with good food, entertainment, and time shared together.
