Audiences recently enjoyed the Drama Department's fall production, *The Mousetrap* on November 19-21. This classic play by Agatha Christie holds a place of distinction as the longest running play in the history of modern theatre.

The mystery's intricate plot involved a group of snowbound travelers who found themselves potential victims of an unknown psychopathic murderer. A surprise ending held the audience in suspense until the true identity of the murderer became known.

Winter schedule enriched by new course selections

Regular curriculum additions reflect the growing academic program at Michigan Christian College. Business students have two new courses available to them during the winter semester, *Introduction to Computer Programming* and *Microeconomics*.

Criminal Law and Procedure and Legal Research and Writing are being offered for the first time as part of the new Legal Assistant Program. Those interested in development of a flexible reading rate may register for Efficient Reading, a seven-week course emphasizing skimming and scanning techniques.

Although not yet a part of the regular curriculum, four special courses are being offered during the winter semester on the basis of student and faculty interest. They include *Christian Woman*, a practical Bible class for women taught by Mrs. Margaret Southern; *Art for the Elementary Teacher*; and two literature courses, *Comedy of Manners* and *American Novel*.

Winter semester will also introduce Mrs. LaJuana Gill to the classroom as she teaches *Two-Dimensional Design* this term. Mrs. Gill previously served on the faculty of the Harding Academy, and on the professional design staff of the J.L. Hudson Company in Detroit.

Despite misconceptions about the effect of federal and state budget cuts upon financial aid, most students continue to receive help with college expenses. Figures released by Kent Hoggatt, MCC Director of Financial Aid, reveal that \$889,097 in financial aid has been awarded to MCC students for the 1981-82 academic year.

Most students still

The average financial aid package for the large majority of students who are receiving aid is \$2,900. This average covers over two-thirds of the expenses for a full-time boarding student. However, those meeting early aid application deadlines are receiving both the largest and the best financial aid packages, consisting of larger proportions of grant aid.

Federal funded aid programs account for \$570,895 of the awards. Grants make up about 39% of this figure, while loans and work programs complete the remainder.

Michigan residents are receiving \$198,000 in aid from state funded grant programs. These grants are available to state residents only when they attend a private college in Michigan. Early applications for these grants is particularly urgent. State loans total \$73,075.

College sponsored programs, consisting of various types of awards and scholar-ships, total \$47,127. Profits from the MCC Bookstore help provide funding of these programs.

Students interested in receiving financial aid for the 1982-83 academic year are encouraged to apply for aid during the months of January and February. More information about financial aid programs and application forms may be obtained from MCC.
