



New facility nears opening on property bordering campus

Nearly five years of planning and waiting will end in April as the Rochester Church of Christ moves to its new building. The new facility is located on property bordering the southeast corner of the Michigan Christian College campus.

Since the Rochester congregation provides a church home for many students while they are enrolled at MCC, church leaders made arrangements in 1985 to purchase eight acres from the college for construction of a new facility. A building committee began their planning two months later and site development began in January of 1989.

The new 30,000 square foot facility features an auditorium with a normal seating capacity of 949. A large foyer with glass windows looking into the auditorium provides substantial overflow seating. Classrooms and large multi-use areas are located in two wings.

MCC students will benefit particularly from the opening of the new building since it is within walking distance of the campus. In addition, the church plans to make the auditorium and fellowship hall available for special college functions.

In the fall, the annual MCC Lectureship will move to the new building. The college also plans to open a Child Development Center in the new facility. The center will serve community and church families with day care services and will provide opportunities for class observation and internships in the new Early Childhood program.

Michigan Christian College and the Rochester Church of Christ, though independent of one another, have grown together for thirty years. The location of the new church facility should provide even further opportunities for mutual encouragement and service.



Paralegal students begin utilizing computer research

Students enrolled in the Legal Assistant Program of Michigan Christian College recently began training in computer-assisted legal research. This training provides invaluable exposure to a new method of research that is becoming common in law offices.

The training program, developed by Open Window, Inc., is designed to simulate the WESTLAW legal research system and to give the user instructional guidance in computer research. WESTLAW is the major computer data base used in modern law offices. It includes all federal and state laws, case histories, and news on current legal issues.

Dr. John Todd, Director of the MCC Legal Assistant Program, donated the Open Window training diskettes to expose his students to an additional research method. Along with research from MCC's Michigan Law Library, Dr. Todd is requiring each student to log several hours of hands-on experience with the WEST-LAW training materials.

MCC added the Legal Assistant Program in 1981. The two-year program leads to an Associate in Applied Science degree. Students may seek employment upon completion of the degree in such places as law offices, insurance companies, and governmental agencies.

The MCC Legal Assistant Program features eight specialized law classes and an internship. It provides training in such areas as civil litigation, real estate matters, wills and probate administration, and criminal case work.

Statistics from the U.S. Department of Labor list the paralegal profession among the fastest growing occupations during the next decade. They predict a 104% increase in the profession by the year 2000.
