Growth in college's popular hometown tops Michigan list

Preliminary 1990 population figures released by the U.S. Census Bureau confirm what students of Michigan Christian College have known for a long time. The Rochester community is a great place to live!

From all indications, the numerical growth of Rochester Hills over the past ten years has surpassed that of every other community in the state. The population has increased 51% from 40,704 residents in 1980 to 61,523 in 1990.

The same unique mixture of country charm and modern development that has attracted thousands to Rochester Hills has proved equally attractive to the students of Michigan Christian College. In addition, unprecedented commercial growth has provided MCC students with limitless opportunities for part-time jobs and internships.

Downtown Rochester has maintained the atmosphere of a small town, complete with a variety of shops and a beautiful city park. Nearby cider mills, which have operated for over 100 years, have helped the area preserve a part of its country heritage.

In contrast, the surrounding city of Rochester Hills has emerged as an affluent residential community with all the privileges of suburban living. Three enclosed shopping malls, nine shopping centers, over sixty restaurants, and three movie complexes with twenty-three screens have opened in recent years.

Cultural events also abound in the Rochester community. The area has developed a reputation for the internationally acclaimed Meadow Brook Theatre and Music Festival and for such events as the Art'n Apples Festival.

The growth of the Rochester community has impacted MCC students in a positive way. Not only have they found themselves in a popular city, but in an ideal college community as well.

At a Glance

Adding a new dimension to the fall student body, the college enrolled its first seniors in the Counseling major of the Bachelor of Religious Education degree. The college began offering the Counseling major last fall for those students desiring a background in personal, marriage and family, or child counseling.

Students from Michigan Christian College joined campaigners from three other Christian colleges this past summer for a seven-week campaign in Europe. For the second year, the MCC team focused its efforts in Hildsheim, West Germany. After the campaign ended, two members of the MCC team remained in Germany for six months of follow-up work.

Autumn recently restructured into a smaller six-member group. You may schedule this dynamic group for a youth activity by phoning the Admissions Office.

States represented in the fall student body include Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, New Hampshire, New York, Ohio, Tennessee, Texas, and Vermont. International students enrolled from Indonesia, Japan, and Zimbabwe.

Improvements mark opening of new year

Changes in the campus food service and the mode of transportation for traveling groups caught the attention of students as they began arriving on campus for the fall semester. Those changes sparked an extra degree of enthusiasm among students as they began the thirty-second academic year of Michigan Christian College.

During the summer, the administration decided to operate the food service in-house rather than contracting with a private company. They employed a chef with experience in several five-star restaurants to serve as Food Service Director.

Since 1980, athletic teams, the chorus, and various other student groups have traveled throughout the country in an older model diesel bus. Although the bus has provided dependable service for a decade, a recent need for major repairs made further investment in the bus impractical. After a considerable search, the college located and purchased a newer bus, which seats forty-seven passengers. The bus arrived on time for the opening of the new academic year.
