Method


The data used in this study were extracted from End of Session data comprised of the following terms: Winter 2003, Spring 2003, Summer 2003, and Fall 2003.

Summary


In summary, the sample consisted of 250 PLG students, 24 of whom had never previously attended OCC (or any other college). The data indicate that PLG students were more likely to maintain the following attributes:

- ➤ Educational goal of obtaining an OCC degree or certificate (63.9%);
- > Female (87.4%);
- ➤ 40 years old or higher (30.0%);
- ➤ Caucasian (70.1%).


The following charts and analyses offer a more accurate insight into these findings.




 The data indicate that 42.0% of Paralegal students for 2003 were previously enrolled in Winter 2003. This includes all students for the 2003 calendar year.




• The chart above indicates that 9.6% of Paralegal students for 2003 were FTIAC (First Time in Any College) students (24 students).




 Obtaining an OCC degree or certificate was the educational goal of most Paralegal students (63.9%) in 2003, with 22.2% intending to transfer after obtaining a degree or certificate.



In 2003, most Paralegal students (87.4%) were female.



 Differences among age groups were relatively slight. Only 19.2% of Paralegal students in 2003 were of traditional college age (18-22 yrs.). Forty year-olds and older made up nearly a third of the total (30.0%).



Most Paralegal students (70.1%) were Caucasian, with 17.8% African American.
