## XEYNOTE YDOLOGY

Sunday, September 27, at II:00 A.M. and 7:30 P.M., Mr. Clyde Balderson will "keynote" the subject. Following graduate work at Wayne State University, Mr. Balderson joined the faculty of Michigan Christian College and served as Dean of Students in 1965 and 1966. In addition to his teaching responsibilities, Mr. Balderson preaches for the Rochester Church of Christ.

Monday, September 28, at 7:30 P.M., Dr. Joseph F. Jones will speak on "Ecological Problems". Dr. Jones is well qualified to speak on this important subject. He earned his B.A. degree from Pepperdine College in 1947 and a M.A. the following year. He received a second Master's Degree from the University of Michigan and completed his Doctorate at Oklahoma State University. He presently serves as Dean of Michigan Christian College.

Tuesday, September 29, at 7:30 P.M., Mr. Zebedee Bishop, who preaches regularly for the Wyoming Church of Christ, 2013I Wyoming Avenue, Detroit, will speak on "Racial Problems". Mr. Bishop has lectured extensively on this critical and timely subject and is probably as well informed as any man in the metropolitan area on this problem and its solution. Wednesday, September 30, at 7:30 P.M., a young man will speak on one of the most vital of today's problems, "Drugs". Mr. Jerry Rushford who will be 28 years of age in December has attended the following colleges. Great Lakes, Michigan Christian, Oklahoma Christian, Harding, Abilene Christian College and Earlham School of Religion. He holds the A.A.; B.A., M.A. and S.T.B. degrees. He presently preaches for the Hazel Park Church of Christ and is Professor of Bible at Michigan Christian College, where he also serves as head basketball coach.

Thursday, October I, at 7:30 P.M., the series will come to a close with a discussion of "Crime". For this important subject, we present one of the best informed men to be found anywhere. Mr. Hubert Locke, who holds the A.B., D.B., A.M., and D.D. Degrees,is presently Director of the Office of Religious Affairs for Wayne State University. During the years 1963–1966, while on leave of Absence from Wayne State, he served as Executive Director of the Citizens Committee for Equal Opportunity, and in 1966 and 1967 he was Administrative Assistant to the Detroit Commissioner of Police. He serves on the Board of Directors for more than a dozen organizations and is the author of a number of books, including "The Detroit Riot of 1967".
