After a seven-month study of history of the restoration movement, twelve members of the Hazel Park, Mich., church toured the Alexander Campbell homestead in Bethany, W. Va. Jerry Rushford, teacher of the class and minister of the Hazel Park church, organized the trip. They visited Bethany College which was begun by Campbell, the Campbell family cemetery and Campbell's grave, the baptismal sight in Buffalo Creek where Campbell and six others were baptized in 1812, and the Brush Run church building which was

the first building erected by Restorationists. The Hazel Park group ended their three-day trip with a worship service at the Brush Run site.
