GOOD AFTERNOON. I am Margaret Auer, Dean of the UDM Libraries and immediate past chair of the DALNET Board of Directors. The Board, wishes to take this opportunity to express its appreciation and admiration for the yeomen efforts demonstrated by the DALNET system staff, the Project Managers and others during the transition from NOTIS to Horizon.

Six years go by quickly, and it is hard to believe that it was six years ago when the DALNET Board and project managers participated in the day-long visioning retreat to discuss the direction DALNET wanted to take for the future.

I am still not certain whether that vision-development day was followed by a feeler call from Ameritech, or the then President of DALNET, Patricia Breivik made a feeler call to Ameritech. Whichever was the case, a Partnership team was put into place for the feasibility study. Tom Burns, Bill Easton, and Mari Franklin must be recognized for their representation of then Ameritech and their willingness to listen and compromise; while six people represented DALNET; of these six, only three are still working in DALNET institutions: Louise Bugg, Mary Ann Sheble, and myself -- John Houser, Michele Klein, and Frank White have moved on to other positions -- but each should be recognized for their efforts -- and Frank-is-coming-back.

Seventeen months of feasibility studying led to the recommendation to move forward; the contract negotiation team added Bob Harris, Patricia, and Wayne State counsel, Lou Lessem; the Board and Negotiating Team publicly expresses its appreciation to Lou (Lou provided us with sound counsel, but he was

amazed at the trust which had been built at the table); Ameritech at different times added its legal counsel, its system engineer, and its President, Lana Porter, to our negotiation meetings. After many month, the DALNET Board of Directors approved the Partnership and the Contract.

So, these are the people who put you in the situation -- the requirement to move from NOTIS to Horizon. They are the ones who got the ball rolling on a very tight deadline.

But, you, the DALNET, Wayne, and DPL technical and systems personnel, were up to the task. You trained, you learned by experimenting, you tested, you benchmarked, you tried something different, you worked late, you came in early, you disrupted you lives -- all to bring up Horizon on schedule at each of our institutions. You worked for the new, while still maintaining the old. You made the new system work as each DALNET institution was added, while you extracted data, preserved reports, and kept the old system running until the very last moment. The DALNET Board of Directors recognizes and appreciates your dedication to this project. PAUSE
