
The freshman-to-sophomore persistence rate

• A measure of the percentage of first-time, full-time degree seeking students enrolled the following fall semester. (IPEDS)


The cohort graduation rate


• The percentage of an entering class that graduates within three years (150% normal time) with an associate's degree. (IPEDS)

Conditions for Student Success

1) Expectations

- College
 - **x** Requirements of degree completion
 - Profile of a successful student
 - × Syllabi: grading and classroom assessment
- Student's personal standard
 - Grades, study time and attendance

2) Support

- Tutoring/ Academic
- Educational and Career Counseling
- Financial

3) Feedback to the students

- Frequent feedback of performance
- o Timely: students and faculty can adjust their approach

4) Involvement (engagement)

- Peers, faculty and staff
 - Service learning
 - **K** Group work
 - Social organizations and clubs
