Recommendations of the Liberal Arts Degree Committee
Presented at the January 28, 2015 Academic Senate college meeting
I. Associate of Arts Degree
a. Summary: The committee recommends the creation of a new associate degree to be called the Associate of Arts (AA).
b. Overview: The AA degree will maximize student completability and transferability (1) by being in conformity with Michigan Transfer Degree requirements and (2) by offering the student the maximum flexibility in taking courses that will complete requirements of programs of study at transfer institutions.
c. Degree Requirements
i. 30-36 credits (depending upon which courses are selected) that satisfy Michigan Transfer Degree requirements.

1. 1 course from the MTA English Composition list
2. 1 course from the MTA Communications list
3. 1 course from the MTA Mathematics list
4. 2 courses of different disciplines from the MTA Social Sciences list
5. 2 courses of different disciplines from the MTA Fine/Arts Humanities list
6. 2 courses of different disciplines from the MTA Natural Sciences list, one of which much include a laboratory component
ii. Remaining necessary electives to total at least 62 credits from courses numbered 1000 through 2999.
iii. All courses must be completed with a grade of 2.0 or higher.
II. Associate in Liberal Arts Degree
a. Summary: The committee recommends making a number of changes to the Associate in Liberal Arts degree (ALA).
b. Overview: The ALA degree will continue to require a breadth of experience and academic rigor, and it will be changed to conform to the Michigan Transfer Agreement in order to increase the transferability of its coursework to other institutions.
c. Degree Requirements
i. 30-36 credits (depending upon which courses are selected) that satisfy Michigan Transfer Degree requirements.
7. 1 course from the MTA English Composition list
8. 1 course from the MTA Communications list
9. 1 course from the MTA Mathematics list
10. 2 courses of different disciplines from the MTA Social Sciences list
11. 2 courses of different disciplines from the MTA Fine Art/Humanities list

ii. Additional required coursework
13. A third ENG or COM course from the MTA lists
14. A third Social Sciences course from the MTA Social Sciences list
15. A third Fine Arts/Humanities course from the General Education list
16. A course from the Physical Education General Education list
iii. Remaining necessary electives to total at least 62 credits from courses numbered 1000 through 2999.
iv. All courses must be completed with a grade of 2.0 or higher.
