The 12th Annual Bible Lectureship of Michigan Christian College will begin at 6 p.m. Sunday, October 12 in the auditorium of the local Church of Christ at 127 E. Avon Road. A period of congregational singing under the direction of Mr. Ed Ritchie is scheduled from 6 to 6:45 p.m.

Dan H. Woodroof, presently serving as Director of Public Relations at the College, will deliver the first lecture in the Series. He formerly served as minister of the Rochester church from 1962-1966. For several years he has served as the Associate Director of Lectureships with MCC President Lucien Palmer. On November 2, he will resume full-time preaching with the church in Kerrville, Texas.

Reuel Lemmons, editor of the FIRM FOUNDATION in Austin, Texas will speak Monday night on the Lectureship Theme *"Thy Will Be Done"*. He will also be the featured speaker at the monthly Preachers' luncheon on Monday at noon.

Paul Faulkner, a practicing psychologist in Abilene, Texas and professor at Abilene Christian College, will deliver the major address on Tuesday night. His subject will be of special interest to Bible class teachers. His name is not familiar in the Michigan area but Dr. Faulkner is a speaker of unusual ability and is one whom young and old should not miss. On Tuesday at 6 p.m. the College will be honoring all Bible class teachers in the annual Teachers' Banquet.

Stanley Shipp will be back again this year on Wednesday evening to develop the subject *"For Thine is the Kingdom, and the Power and the Glory"*.

Batsell Barrett Baxter, national television personality on the Herald of Truth program and Bible Department Head at David Lipscomb College will climax the Lectureship on Thursday evening.

The 10 a.m. chapel sessions will be equally interesting with Gene Carrell of Columbus, Ohio on Monday, G. P. Holt of Indianapolis on Tuesday, Paul Faulkner on Wednesday, and Leon Matheny of Canton, Ohio on Thursday.

Classes have been expanded this year to four. Russell Artist, of David Lipscomb College will teach the 9:15 a.m. class on *"God or Evolution?"*. Two classes for ladies are scheduled for 11 a.m. Mrs. Peggy Morton and Mrs. Bell Parsons will conduct a training class for Bible teachers and Mrs. T. B. Thompson of Birmingham, Alabama will lecture each day.
