

### **DALNET**

### A Leader in Library Partnerships

**DALNET** is a consortium of academic, public, and special libraries located in Southeast Michigan. Founded as a nonprofit corporation in 1985, DALNET enables its members to better serve the information needs of their users through cooperative efforts among multi-type libraries in the Metropolitan Detroit area, and by sharing advanced library automation applications.

DALNET has over ten years of experience running a shared integrated library system and fostering cooperation and innovation in a complex environment. As a leader, DALNET is constantly finding new ways to broaden services and access, incorporating advances in technology into the system in an efficient and cost-effective way. Membership in DALNET opens the door to a wealth of technical and human resources far beyond what is available to any single institution.

### The Partnership and Cooperation

DALNET policy is set by its Board, with officers elected annually for the positions of Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary. Member institutions sign individual service agreements to participate in the DALNET Online System. Decision-making is accomplished with every full member institution having representation on the DALNET Board and, if desired, in various policy-making committees and task forces. Membership is open to academic, public, school, and special libraries as well as other information organizations in seven southeast Michigan counties. To make the regional information hub possible, DALNET members agree to share an online system, contribute to its database, and are committed to resource sharing.

DALNET's business principles maximize members' investments. DALNET strives to engage in cost-effective practices; to share local and central site expertise; to be efficient in all operational areas; to gather, evaluate and distribute relevant information before reaching a decision; to respect local institutional values/principles and operational priorities; and to develop effective group processes for good decision-making.

#### The Vision

By the year 2000, DALNET will be widely recognized as a model cooperative information services provider, one that anticipates and supports the information needs of a diverse community of users in southeast Michigan. DALNET will be a regional information provider of unique resources to members and their communities. DALNET members will continue to be advocates for access to the global knowledge-based opportunities at the local community level.

To implement this vision DALNET libraries are currently migrating from the main-frame LUIS system to a new, state of the art system. The new system called Im@gine uses Horizon© software a product of Ameritech Library Services. Horizon employs client-server architecture and is fully integrated with the World Wide Web.

Some of the features of Im@gine are:

- Graphical display with a point and click interface.
- Access via the World Wide Web from home, office or worldwide.
- Works with popular World Wide Web software such as Netscape© or Internet Explorer©.
- "Search redirection" click on a title, author or subject heading to submit a new search on that heading.
- Gateway to World Wide Web resources worldwide-integrating remote resources within the local system.
- Ability to directly link catalog records to multimedia sources including full text and images.

# Improving the Means To Access Tomorrow

Through the partnership between DALNET libraries and Ameritech further product enhancements are being developed for Im@gine. These enhancements will:

- Provide a children's OPAC client that is easy-to-use graphical interface for children, which includes the following features: a set of librariandesigned canned searches, spellchecking, ranked retrieval sets, and concept searching.
- Enable DALNET libraries to share a single patron record for users with differing circulation privileges at multiple libraries.
- Provide an authentication system for users who belong to multiple user groups with access to different databases, whether locally housed or remotely accesses via Web or Z39.50 interfaces.
- Enable DALNET libraries to use a single, shared authority file efficiently in a multi-institution configuration, with appropriate display of references in location-based catalogs
- Enable staff at DALNET libraries to easily run their own ad-hoc management and statistical reports with minimal central site support.
- Add an integrated booking module including full patron empowerment and staff management features.
- Enable handling document requests from patrons with variable privileges in a multi-type consortium environment, with interfaces for both the OCLC and DOCLINE interlibrary loan systems.
