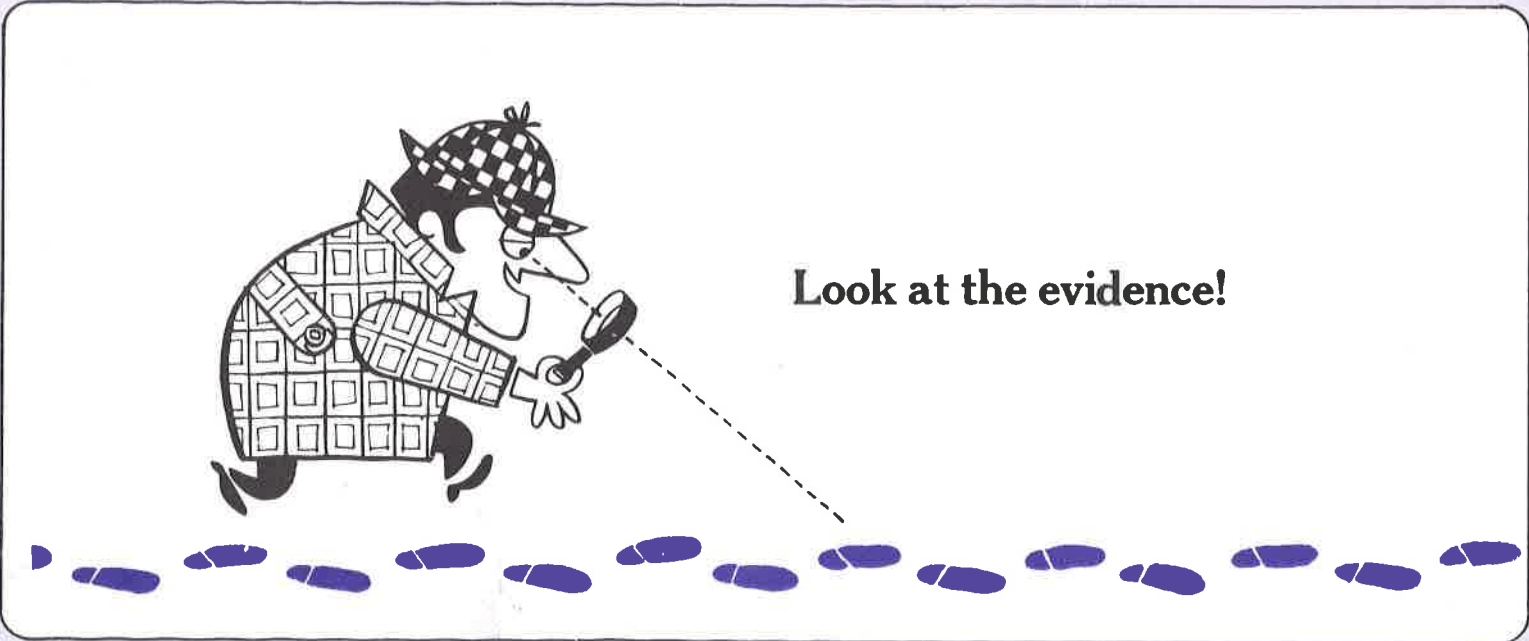


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**Look at the evidence!**

# Look At The Evidence

There are convincing reasons why the high school graduate should consider Michigan Christian Junior College for his first two years of higher education. While each of these reasons will appeal to certain individuals differently, all of them merit thoughtful consideration. What can MCC offer the high school graduate? How can it assist him in the pursuit of his life's goals? *Let's look at the evidence.*

## Personal Adjustment and Development

The basic educational philosophy of Michigan Christian places *concern for the student* high in its list of objectives. From high school the young person must move into a new world and assume growing responsibilities. Gnawing questions demand answers. What about his career? His marriage? His continued intellectual and social growth? What about his personal relationships in life? These concerns are not isolated from nor unrelated to college education. Within the framework of Michigan Christian College's campus life and curriculum the student finds understanding, challenge, and direction toward adult development and maturity. *Study the evidence.*

## Liberal Arts Background

Students find at MCC an unusually well qualified faculty, readily capable of providing intellectual stimulus and challenge. The programs of required and elective courses leading toward the Associate Degree in Arts or Science or the Junior College Certificate provide a rich educational background in the liberal arts, laying an adequate academic foundation for the student's later major in most fields of study. MCC is adequately equipped for her main educational task. *Evaluate the evidence.*

## Transfer to Senior Colleges

MCC students who transfer to other colleges after their graduation usually maintain their academic level begun here . . . or perform at a higher level. Whether transferring to another Christian college or to a state institution, *work accumulated at MCC is fully accepted.* MCC enjoys a wholesome respect from other institutions in the field of higher education. Students during the past nine years have transferred to more than sixty different colleges and universities. *Weigh carefully the evidence.*

## Quality Instruction

MCC faculty members combine in a unique way the qualities of thorough academic training, experience, and Christian commitment. All fulltime, permanent appointments on the faculty hold graduate degrees from recognized colleges and universities. As a *junior* college, faculty stress is laid on effective instruction; as a *Christian* junior college, emphasis is placed on concern for the academic and personal growth of each student. Alumni testimony is abundant. *Think about the evidence.*

## Making Life's Decisions

Many fundamental questions confront the high school graduate, and many of his answers will come within the first two years of college experience. For instance, what career will he pursue? Perhaps eighty percent of college freshmen do not have firm and clear answers to this question. But at the completion of two years, eighty percent will have decided, and will be pursuing their educational preparation toward life's career. Competent faculty counselors, through special testing and guidance programs, assist the student in making such major decisions. *Consider the evidence.*

## Cultivating Friendships

Every young person needs close friends who share his values and interests. At MCC the college freshman makes life-long friendships; and out of these friendships may come Christian marriages and Christian homes. Separations and divorces hardly exist among those who attend Christian colleges. At MCC moral and spiritual foundations are laid for successful family life. *Accept the evidence.*

## Christian Environment

Within the framework of God's Will all life and activity at MCC is nestled. Opportunities for student involvement are present from the first day of his enrollment. Worship, class work, athletics, musical performances, dramatic productions, work, recreation, dating — *all* student activities are related to the teachings of Jesus Christ.
