

Some Facts You Should Know About Michigan Christian College

WHAT KIND OF COLLEGE IS MICHIGAN CHRISTIAN COLLEGE?

MCC is a liberal arts junior college emphasizing Christian ideals. Although not organically connected with any religious body, the college receives its principal support from members of the churches of Christ. Students from any religious faith may attend.

WHY SHOULD I GO TO A CHRISTIAN COLLEGE?

A Christian college offers many special benefits. Christian teachers take a special interest in each student. Clean, wholesome recreation offers every student opportunity for social development. Bible classes and chapel, as well as Christian fellowship, encourage spiritual development. Life-long friendships, bound firmly by common interests are an extra reward of life at a Christian college.

IS MICHIGAN CHRISTIAN COLLEGE ACCREDITED?

MCC is a recognized Candidate Member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and is approved by the Michigan Department of Public Instruction and is listed in the Educational Directory in the Office of Education, U. S. Department of Health, Education and Wefare. Appropriate agencies have approved the college for the education of veterans and the training of foreign students. MCC holds membership in the American Association of Junior Colleges, Michigan Association of Junior and Community Colleges, North Central Council of Junior Colleges and National Commission on Accrediation.

WILL I BE ABLE TO TRANSFER CREDIT TO ANOTHER COLLEGE?

Student have transferred credits to over seventy colleges and universities in the United States. If your grades are satisfactory, you will experience no difficulty in transferring credits.

HOW MANY JUNIOR COLLEGE CREDITS MAY I TRANSFER TO A SENIOR COLLEGE?

In most cases, a maximum of 96 credit hours (64 semester hours) are transferable to a senior college. 96 quarter hours are normally acquired during a two year (six quarters) period. In many cases whenever a student has completed the A.A. or A.S. degree

program, he may expect also to transfer even an occasional "D" grade to a senior college, depending upon the policies of the college to which tranfer is made.

WHAT COURSES ARE AVAILABLE?

Courses are offered in seven major divisions: Biblical Studies, Business Administration, Fine and Applied Arts, Language and Literature, Natural Sciences and Mathematics, Physical Education, and Social Sciences. Students are able to receive a broad general education program which will prepare them to do upper division work at a senior college.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO ATTEND MCC?

Tuition and fees for an average academic load will cost approximately \$355.00 per quarter. Books will increase that cost slightly. Boarding students pay an additional \$330.00 per quarter for room and board.

ARE FINANCIAL AIDS AVAILABLE?

The college participates in the National Defense Student Loan program, Educational Opportunity Grant program, College Work Study program, Michigan Higher Education Assistance Authority Scholarship and Tuition Grant program, and some private loan funds are available for use. Scholarships are available to students who qualify academically and otherwise. Part time student employment is available to assist with expenses. Any and all financial aids, however, must be applied for as they do not come automatically.

WHAT GRADE AVERAGE IS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION?

Normally, students may be admitted with a minimum of a 2.0 grade point average. Otherwise, applications may be considered on an individual basis and admission may be granted on a probationary basis.

WHAT HIGH SCHOOL SUBJECTS ARE REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION?

Assuming that grades are satisfactory, a student may qualify for admission on the basis of graduation from an accredited high school. You are strongly urged to take a college preparatory program in high school.

IS AN ENTRANCE EXAM REQUIRED?

The ACT examination is required for admission. Students should consult high school counselors for registeration for the ACT examination.

WHEN SHOULD I APPLY?

Although there is no application deadline, ample time must be allowed for processing. You are strongly urged to apply ninety days to one year prior to the time you intend to enroll.

WHEN SHOULD TRANSCRIPT BE SENT?

When you send your application for admission, you should request your high school principal or counselor to send a copy of your official transcript showing grades for courses completed and include a list of courses in progress. When grades for the final semester are available, a supplementary transcript should be sent. Transfer students should follow the same procedure with regard to college transcripts. Transfer students will also be required to have high school transcripts sents.

DOES MICHIGAN CHRISTIAN COLLEGE PARTICIPATE IN INTER-COLLEGIATE SPORTS?

MCC is a member of the Michigan Christian College Athletic Conference. The college participates in regularly scheduled league and tournament basketball and baseball competition. In addition to intercollegiate competition, the college provides opportunity for participation in a variety of intramural sports such as touch football, softball, basketball, baseball, volleyball, badminton, tennis and horseshoes.

WHAT ABOUT EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES?

A number of student activities play important roles in college life. Several traditional social events characterize the school year . . . banquets, social club activities, etc. Among organizations which fulfill extracurricular interests are: Student Government, College Newspaper, Yearbook, A Cappella Chorus, Dramatics, Religious Organizations, Special Interest Clubs and others.
