THE PLACE TO BE



ON CAMPUS LIVING. Approximately 85% of the MCC student body which is represented by several states and foreign countries lives in one of the college residence halls. The Multi-Purpose Complex and Barbier Residence Hall house men students. Dormitory rent ranges from \$195 to \$202 per semester and board in the college cafeteria costs \$375 per semester. FORMAL LEARNING EXPERIENCES

FULLY ACCREDITED. Academic work at MCC is validated by recognition and full accreditation of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

PERSONALIZED INSTRUCTION. Your teachers know you by name and cause you to feel free to go to them for out of class help, personal counseling, or friendly visits.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PLANS. Since most colleges and universities require a basic core of liberal arts requirements your first two years, you may obtain either MCC's Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree and then go into practically any field of study. Specific areas of study at MCC include:

APPLIED SCIENCE PROGRAMS. Those desiring to end their formal education after their stay at MCC may elect an applied science program in such areas of concentration as secretarial science, mental health, and police science.

TRANSFER OPPORTUNITIES. MCC students have moved on to over seventy colleges and universities over the country.

TECHNICAL COURSES. Those desiring a very special course or two during their stay at MCC may take such courses at either nearby Oakland University or Oakland Community College and apply these courses to their MCC degree.

TUITION. During the 1975-76 school year, tuition will be charged on a thirty-eight dollars per semester hour basis. More about meeting expenses later.

MUIRHEAD LIBRARY. Over 30,000 volumes in a newly remodeled learning center help make up the library. The new microbook *Library of American Civilization* of over 11,000 rare volumes adds to the library's uniqueness.

THREE-TWO PLAN. If you have a B average or better, you may elect to skip your senior year and begin your full-time college program at MCC a year early.

LIBERAL ARTS APPROACH. If you are unsure about a major field of study, you are not alone. The liberal arts approach introduces you to a wide range of future choices while giving you time to decide which is the best for you.





MONEY MATTERS

MONEY IS AVAILABLE. No need to be afraid or discouraged with college costs. After your need is established on the basis of the Parents' Confidential Statement, MCC will help you put together the means to meet that need. Over 70% of the MCC student body receives financial aid.

STATE SCHOLARSHIPS & TUITION GRANTS. Michigan residents may be eligible for up to \$1200 per year to attend MCC. Presently, 45% of the full-time Michigan students at MCC are receiving these awards.

FEDERAL GRANTS. Basic Grants are available in amounts up to \$1050 per year and Supplemental Grants in amounts up to \$1500 per year.

SCHOLARSHIPS. MCC offers Academic Scholarships of up to \$450 per year for those having a 3.00 or better high school grade point average. ACT Scholarships are available to those achieving a 21 or better composite score on the ACT Test.

ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS. You may be eligible for up to \$600 per year from MCC for special ability in music, drama, journalism, basketball, or baseball.

LOW INTEREST LOANS. National Direct Student Loans at 3% interest in amounts up to \$1250 per year and Guaranteed Loans at 7% interest in amounts up to \$2500 per year are available through the Federal Government. Your interest does not start accumulating until after you have completed continuous college work.

WORK OPPORTUNITIES. Campus and offcampus job opportunities are continuously opening up.
