

FINANCIAL AID. Many forms of aid are available to assist you with your tuition. Call and ask.



ROMANS AND GALATIANS (BIB 2123). A careful evaluation of the historical background and establishment of the church in Rome. Exegesis of the text with special attention given to such doctrines as grace, atonement, justification, law, sin, wrath, and death. 1-4 p.m.

WISDOM LITERATURE (BIB 3143). An introduction to and exegesis of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon. 7-10 p.m.

INTRODUCTION TO GREEK STUDIES I (GRE 102). To develop an understanding of the Greek language sufficient to enable a student to use Bible helps to study the New Testament in its original language. This course does not replace GRE 114 and 124, 7-10 p.m.

ART FOR THE TEACHER OF CHILDREN (ART 293). An introduction to art techniques, materials, and methods appropriate to the Bible school. Three hours credit. 12-2:50 p.m.

ART FOR THE BIBLE SCHOOL TEACHER (ART 292). An introduction to art techniques, materials, and methods appropriate to the Bible school. Two hours credit. 1-2:50 p.m.

Other Days

SURVEY OF CHURCH HISTORY (BIB 3313). A survey of church history from the close of the apostolic age through medieval Catholicism and the Protestant Reformation to the present. Wednesdays, 1-4 p.m.

INTERMEDIATE GREEK (GRE 213). To be arranged.

ELEMENTARY HEBREW I (BIB 194). The first term in a study of the Hebrew language. Pre-requisites include one year of Greek (GRE 114 and 124). Time to be arranged.

AMERICAN RELIGIONS (BIB 3423). Thursdays, 7-10 p.m.
