Homecoming participants enjoy a 98-70 victory

Following a special Alumni Chapel and chorus performance on the morning of February 6, students, alumni, and staff gathered at the Avondale High School gymnasium for the annual activities of the Homecoming game. A 98-70 win over William Tyndale College of Farmington Hills, Michigan added to the excitement of the afternoon program.

During halftime ceremonies at the game, queen candidates entered the gym through a tunnel of candlebearers. Mary Ann Feeback of Toledo, Ohio was crowned Homecoming Queen by MCC President Milton Fletcher. Queen Mary Ann's court included Kristin Bryant of Allen Park, Michigan; Deanna Howe of Dayton, Ohio; Roxanne Scarbrough of South Bend, Indiana; and Geannetta Walker of Buffalo, New York. Six former Homecoming Queens also participated in the ceremony.

Immediately following the game, participants returned to campus to prepare for the evening's annual Homecoming Banquet. The banquet featured entertainment by Randy Gill, director of the MCC A Cappella Chorus, and a keynote address by Wayne Baker of the class of 1962.

The Homecoming victory brought the Warriors' season record to 11-2. They subsequently received word of their national ranking in the number two position of the National Little College Athletic Association.

MCC has been recommended to the ACCTion Consortium as a model for student services. Copies of the MCC orientation and advising materials have been made available to other colleges in the ACCTion library.

Interior design students and faculty at Harding University recently hosted Mrs. LuJuana Gill as a consultant and visiting lecturer. Mrs. Gill teaches part-time in the MCC Art Department.

Youth Evangelism served as the theme for a recent youth lectureship in Hamilton, Ohio. MCC students and staff presented the entire program. Speakers included Tony Russell of Detroit and Mark Davison of the Admissions staff. Amy Clayton of Troy, Michigan and Terry McClure of Mt. Morris, Michigan provided classes for the girls, and the 1981 tour group of Autumn provided a program of inspirational singing.

Chorus receives standing ovation at choral festival

Response to an outstanding presentation by the MCC A Cappella Chorus developed into an enthusiastic standing ovation at the annual Christian College Choral Festival on January 9. The only other group to receive special acclamation at the festival was the host chorus of Oklahoma Christian College.

Seventeen choruses, representing fourteen Christian colleges, participated in the festival. The groups combined into a powerful chorus of over 750 singers, which spent several hours in rehearsal with Dr. Eph Ely, a nationally known conductor from the University of Missouri. The combined chorus presented a spectacular performance on Saturday evening in addition to the individual presentations by each group.

En route to Oklahoma, the chorus appeared in Rolla, Missouri. On their return trip to Michigan, they performed for churches in Tulsa, Oklahoma; St. Louis, Missouri; and Matteson, Illinois.

Since returning to campus, the chorus has participated in special festivals with both the Metropolitan Detroit Youth Chorus and the Dayton Youth Chorus. Their spring tour, scheduled from May 8-21, will take the group to Canada, New York, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Ohio.
