Warriors capture North Central District Championship

Sporting a 17-2 season, the Warriors faced the Jordon College Suns of Flint, Michigan on March 3 for the North Central District Championship of the National Little College Association. Both MCC and Jordon had achieved earlier victories over each other.

In the championship game, held at Oakland University in Rochester, MCC scored the first basket and never lost the lead. At the half, the Warriors held a strong twenty-four point edge. Despite Jordon's excellent catch-up ball game in the second half, the Warriors scored two free throws in the last two seconds, giving them an 83-79 victory and the district title.

Regional championship in hand, the Warriors earned a position in the national finals of the NLCAA. Those finals included sixteen teams, which competed for the national title in Norfolk, Nebraska during the third week of March.

For the first game of the national finals, MCC matched off with Blackbyrn College of Carbinville, Illinois. Blackbyrn, the reigning national champion of the NLCAA, achieved an 81-67 victory over the Warriors. St. John's College of Winfield, Kansas claimed a close 67-64 win over MCC on the next afternoon before the team returned to campus.

The Warriors ended their season with an outstanding 18-4 record, including the national tournament. High scorers for the season included Ricky Brown of Statenville, Georgia, who averaged seventeen points per game and Lonnie Fuller of Detroit, Michigan and Noel Roberts of Antigua in the Virgin Islands, who averaged sixteen points each. As Coach Pleasant commented about the team's overall effort and style of play, "*The key to our success was their intensity and very unselfish style of play.*"

Celebration in Song's Camelot highlights High School Day

Morris, Michigan; and Geannetta Walker of Buffalo, New York served as the host and hostesses.

A special matinee performance of Celebration on Saturday highlighted the year's High School Day program. A special chapel program, campus tours, and performances by the MCC A Cappella Chorus and Autumn preceded this performance.

Next year's eighth edition of Celebration in Song will again be presented in conjunction with High School Day. At that time, the students will develop the theme "Reflections" as MCC celebrates its twenty-fifth anniversary.
