With four years of Bible and related courses, MCC offers a special opportunity for active Christians who want more Biblical knowledge. MCC also has an excellent program for the teaching of reading, from the basics to skimming and scanning techniques. The program includes classes which meet weekly throughout the entire term and a special three-week, one night per week, seminar.

Attention is given to such topics as employment interviews and job evaluations. Fall

Old Testament Survey I. History of ancient Isreal from the creation to the fall of the Judean monarchy as revealed in the books of Genesis through II Chronicles. Mondays, 7-10 p.m. Begins Sept. 8.

Romans and Galatians. A careful evaluation of the historical background and establishment of the churches in Rome and Galatia. Exegesis of the text with special attention given to significant doctrines. Wednesdays, 1-4 p.m. Begins Sept. 3.

American Religions. A survey of the major denominations, sects, and cults. Thursdays, 7-10 p.m. Begins Sept. 4.

Teaching God's Word. A study of the principles and methods of teaching, designed to help Bible class teachers of all age groups improve their instructional skills. Mondays, 7-10 p.m. Begins Sept. 8.

Psychology of Counseling. Theories and philosophies underlying current practices in the field of counseling. Special attention given to helping students develop their own theory and techniques. Mondays, 7-10 p.m. Begins Sept. 8.

Spring

Hebrews. Attention to the greatness of the Lordship of Christ, the superiority of His gospel over the law, and the need to serve God faithfully.

Prophetic Literature. Background and message of the prophetic books.

Christian Ethics. An up-to-date survey of current social issues and a careful study of the Biblical response to each of these issues. Possible discussion topics: marriage, divorce, abortion, euthanasia, alcoholism, drugs, civil disobedience, birth-control, human sexuality, race relations, and others.

Missionary Principles. A study of the motives, theories, and practices related to both foreign and domestic mission work. Emphasis placed on the indigenous church, cross-cultural communication, church growth theory, and the role of the local church in the missionary enterprise.

The Christian Woman. Emphasis on her role as teacher, personal worker, wife, and mother.

Complete Schedule

These are only a few of the many courses offered by MCC. Especially for the convenience of mothers with children in school, all courses necessary for the Associate in Arts degree are offered between 9:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. For a complete schedule, call Mrs. Williamson at 651-5800.

Term Dates and Tuition

Fall semester classes meet September 2 to December 19. Winter classes meet January 13 to May 8, 1981. Audit tuition is \$87 for each three-hour course and credit tuition is \$174 for each-three hour course. Some special adult-learner scholarships are also available.
