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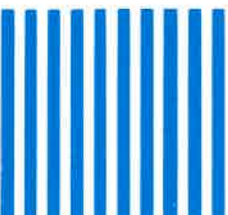

Early Planning Pays!

Wise planning during your junior and senior years of high school can make the transition to college an easy one. Here are a few suggestions to help you with your planning.

- **Concentrate on the basics.** English, math, and reading skills are a must for success in college. Any high school coursework that provides experience in these areas is helpful. Although most colleges offer skill development courses, entering college with strong basic skills will free your schedule for more electives and a better variety of classes in your major.
- **Choose electives wisely.** You would benefit from a high school course in which you learn the keyboard and basic computer skills. Also, you may be eligible to take advanced placement courses in high school and receive college credit upon successful completion of Advanced Placement Examinations in particular subjects.
- **Keep up those grades.** Most colleges offer scholarships to students with good grades. At MCC, such scholarships are given to those with a grade point average of 3.00 (B) or above. The higher the grades, the higher the scholarship.
- **Start shopping early.** Don't hesitate asking for a college catalog. Visit campus on a normal class day. Include a night in the dorms and set in on some classes so you can get a better feel for regular campus life. Look carefully at the college setting as well as the academic program. The fewer the adjustments to campus life necessary, the happier you will be and the better you will do in your chosen field of study.

Fit in Fast at MCC!

- **Make friends fast.** In a small Christian college like MCC, you make some of your closest friends of life within the first few weeks on campus. You get to know most of the students rather than a small circle of friends. In addition, you are surrounded by those who care about you and encourage you to develop a deeper faith.
- **Participate, don't just watch.** As a freshman in a small college, you are more apt to participate in music and drama groups, athletic teams, service organizations, or student government. You don't have to wait to participate.
- **Prepare for your future.** At MCC, you can complete your first two years of almost any four-year degree program. In addition, you can choose from one of several occupational majors designed for immediate employment after MCC. Four-year degree options include Biblical Studies, Christian Ministry, and Counseling. Business will be added soon. All programs are accredited by the North Central Association.
- **Enjoy nature and the suburbs.** A scenic lake surrounded by acres of rolling, wooded hills provides you with a peaceful campus setting. The popular suburb of Rochester Hills offers unlimited opportunities for entertainment, shopping, and off-campus jobs.

Skip Your Senior Year?!?

If you have above a 3.00 (B) average in grades 9-11 and a composite score of 21 or above on the ACT, you are eligible to begin your full-time college work early at MCC under the Three-Two Plan. Many high schools allow students to substitute college level courses for those taken during the senior year of high school. This accelerated program is a great way to get a head start on your college studies.
