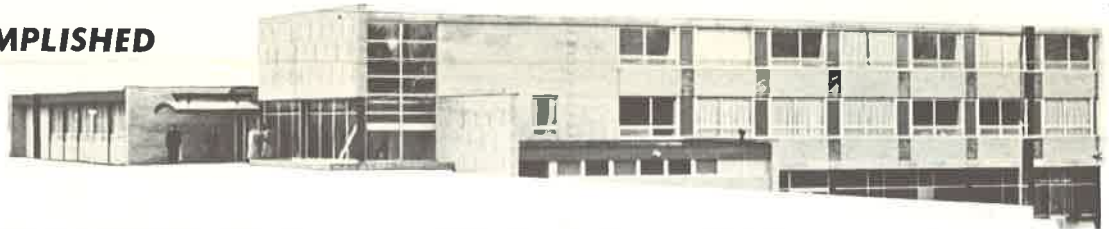

In the past year most of the orchard has been replaced by this new building housing classrooms, administration offices, dormitories, and a modern cafeteria capable of feeding several hundred students.

... BUT IT COULDN'T HAVE HAPPENED without financial assistance from YOU and many other Christians who demonstrated their love for Christian education last year. While maintaining a solid foundation of liberal arts courses the faculty and student body tackled a myriad of campus activities. Here are just a few of the "Firsts" rolled up in the initial school year.



LECTURESHIPS-FORUMS—Two Lectureships held have proved highly successful. In addition, the Annual World Evangelism Workshop, with nearly 100 missionaries participating, was a unique "first" in June, 1960.



MISSIONARY TRAINING — under the direction of Professor Hall, established North Central as the first college to put major emphasis upon this type of training. Several young men who took these courses have left for foreign fields.

CHORUS—Under the direction of Professor Fred Alexander, this group of students reflected the Christian atmosphere of North Central wherever they appeared as guests.



COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES — The students even found time to enter in the annual Rochester parade in December. And their float won honorable mention.

RADIO STATION WNCC — On Feb. 6, 1960, students on the campus tuned in to their own radio station. Using a low-powered transmitter, confining the broadcasts to the campus, news, music and special features were broadcast periodically throughout each day.



Underlying these and many other campus activities were the regular daily classes taught by devoted Christians.

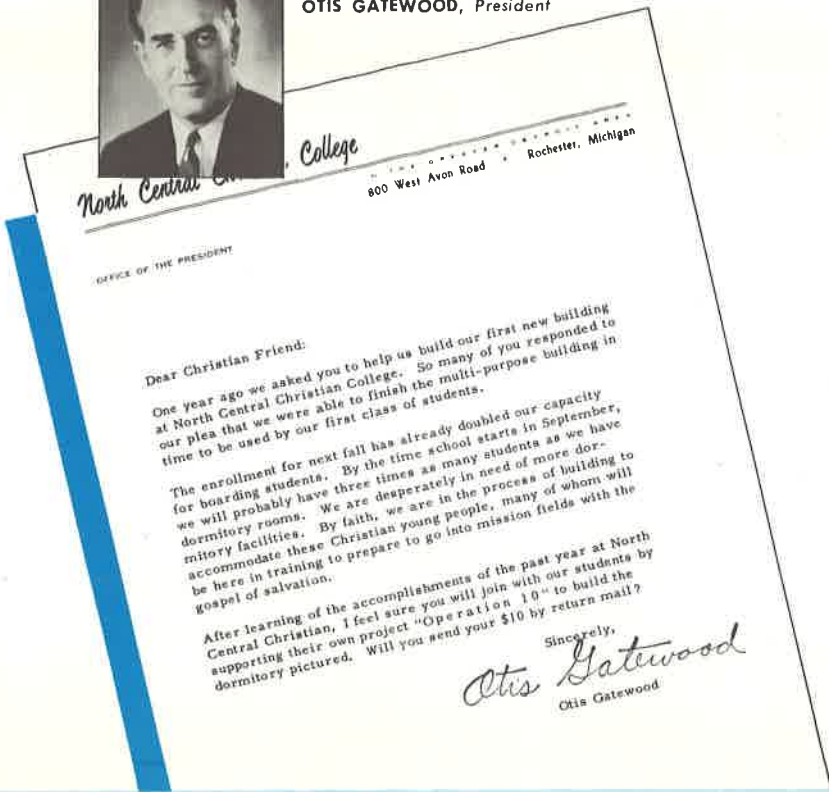
