Michigan Christian College is located in the beautiful and rolling countryside just south of the city limits of Rochester, Michigan. As Rochester celebrates her Centennial year, Michigan Christian completes her first decade of service to young people.

Founded in 1959, the Board of Directors purchased 37 acres of choice land on West Avon Road between Rochester Road and Livernois Road from the estate of Mr. Lou Maxon, a Detroit advertising executive. In 1963 a 7 acre parcel was purchased on the eastern extremity and in 1964 the connecting 54 acres of the late Henry T. Gierok, a former General Motors executive, was purchased.

During this first decade of history, the college has grown to 98 acres of land, nine modern buildings and an audited

overall value of approximately \$1,500,000. The annual budget of the college approaches \$500,000.

The college curriculum is, in general, in the liberal arts field divided into nine divisions of study as listed elsewhere in this folder. Degrees offered on the junior college level are the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science Degrees. Terminal programs are offered to students who follow a curriculum leading to the Junior College Certificate.

In this first ten years, Michigan Christian College has achieved a reputable educational standing among institutions of higher learning all over the country. The college is currently scheduled for "Candidate" membership in the North Central Association of Colleges and Universities. From its small beginning in 1959 to the completion of this decade Michigan Christian College is, indeed, a "Ten Years' Profile in Progress".

... some concerns of Michigan Christian College

SPIRITUAL VALUES. MCC is concerned with developing the whole man; the spiritual as well as the physical and intellectual being of each student. The liberal arts curriculum is taught by a Christian faculty which upholds the Bible as the word of God. The campus environment is conducive to the development of Christian character.

INTELLECTUAL GROWTH. A Christian environment on the college campus does not call for sacrifice of academic excellence. On the contrary, such an environment demands excellence in all areas. MCC students have successfully transferred to over 60 colleges and universities over the nation including the major universities in the state of Michigan.

CULTURAL ADVANCEMENT. MCC offers opportunity through the inter-

personal relationships in a student body of many races and through an understanding of the social and physical sciences to appreciate the cultural, historic, and aesthetic heritage of our world.

RESPONSIBLE CITIZENSHIP. The depth of the training available at Michigan Christian is found in the College's broad scope of the preparation believed necessary for the student to perform the responsibilities of good citizenship in the home and the community; to pursue a useful and personally satisfying vocation; to respect the dignity and rights of all peoples regardless of race, religion, or economic status.
