Art Linkletter

A radio and television star for more than 45 years, Art Linkletter has performed in two of the longest running shows

in broadcasting history.

House Party was on daytime CBS radio and television, five days a week, 52 weeks per year for 25 years. It won an Emmy Award for the best daytime show, and four Emmy nominations. People Are Funny, on nighttime NBC Radio and Television, ran weekdays, 52 weeks per year for 19 years, and was consistently in the top ten rating list. It won three Emmy nominations.

Art has been writing books since 1950. Of his many books, Kids Say the Darndest Things is one of the top 15 best sellers in American publishing history, and was number one for two straight years on the non-fiction list.

Art has served on the Pres-



ident's National Advisory Council for Drug Abuse Prevention, and on the Presidential Commission to Improve

Reading in the U.S. He was also President of the National Coordinating Council on Drug Abuse Education and Information, Inc., headquartered in Washington, D.C.

Art has been married to Lois (Foster) since 1935. On Thanksgiving Day they will have been married 70 years. The Linkletters had five children, three daughters and two sons. Of the three remaining children, Jack, the eldest, is married with two sons and a daughter. Daughter Dawn is married and has twin boys, and Sharon is married and has two daughters.

Rochester College A Cappella Chorus

The Music Department of Rochester College offers training for students interested in pursuing careers in music as well as a general music education for all students. Students may earn a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree in Music, a Bachelor of Science in Music Education, a Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies with a concentration in music, or may minor in music as part of any other bachelor's degree at Rochester College. The department offers students the opportunity for aesthetic expression through such performing ensembles as the A Cappella Chorus, Concert Band, and Autumn, as well as participation in the annual review *Celebration*. The A Cappella Chorus serves as an important musical ambassador for the college. Now in its 45th year, it presents over twenty concerts each year throughout the Midwest and Canada. The Chorus is under the direction of Dr. Joe R. Bentley, who has directed the Chorus since 1986.

Metro Detroit Youth Chorus

The Metropolitan Detroit Youth Chorus is currently in its 41st year of ministering with music to people in the metropolitan Detroit area and around the country! MDYC is comprised of young people ranging in age from 14-18. As a group of a cappella singers, the Chorus provides a musical experience that encourages members and listeners in devotion to Christ and Christian principles. Membership has grown from 18 members in 1964 to 110 in 2004. Members of the Chorus represent over 20 congregations of the Churches of Christ and other Christian churches throughout the metropolitan Detroit area. Mr. Tim Meixner is the director of Metropolitan Detroit Youth Chorus.

The Associates Fall Festival, renamed the Rochester Fall Festival, returns on Saturday, October 1, 2005. This year, Rochester College revamped the Festival, making it less of a "country-style fair" and more of an attraction that would draw a broader and even larger crowd with "extreme" events such as a bungee jump, sky trail and climbing wall available. About Rochester College

In 1954, members of the Church of Christ formed a Board of Trustees to establish a college in the north central United States. The new Board purchased land near rural Rochester, Michigan, and the first students arrived at North Central Christian College in 1959. Several years later, NCCC became Michigan Christian College. In 1997, the Board adopted the name Rochester College. That same year, the Board reaffirmed the founders' dedication to "the task of leading students toward high academic achievement ... and the development of Christian ideals."

Over the years, the campus of Rochester College has grown and the college leaders have continued to develop and modify programs that will meet the changing needs of our students. In 1999, the college adopted a new strategic plan, *A Decade of Vision*, designed to guide the institution into the twenty-first century with additional programs and services.

In a typical year, students arrive from more than a dozen states and about ten different countries. Alumni are scattered in many places, around the nation and the world.

Since its inception, Rochester College has emphasized the importance of combining academic excellence with Christian ideals. While the College admits students of all

races and religions and carefully explains varying worldviews in relevant courses, it employs only those professors and instructors who understand, practice, and teach the Christian faith. Regardless of their discipline, faculty members routinely relate their subject matter to relevant principles and concepts of Christianity.
