


ROCHESTER COLLEGE


Alumni




outside the box In terms of our curriculum

DAVE RAMSEY COURSE



PONTIAC EARLY COLLEGE




EDUCATION

Each year, Rochester College awards nearly \$2.7 million in scholarships. This offsets only about 25% of the cost of tuition for students. To achieve our mission, we need your help.
