






Over sixty percent of the residents in Livingston County are between the ages of 18 and 64.


By 2030, 58% of the residents will be between the ages of 18 and 64.



POPULATION BY RACE AND HISPANIC ORIGIN CENSUS 2000 N=156,951




- An overwhelming majority of the residents are Caucasian.

The Census Bureau estimated that Livingston County's population in July 2003 would rise to 172, 881. This is a 10.1 percent increase from 2000.


